# COMMUNICATION STUDIES - BACHELOR OF ARTS (ONLINE)

In addition to completing the general education requirements of the university and the college, students majoring in communication studies are required to complete 21 credits of core COMM courses and 15 credits of COMM electives for a total of 36 credits. Any exception to these policies requires approval from the department head.

All COMM courses must be completed with a grade of C- or better.

#### Option 4:

Participate in an experiential learning study abroad course sponsored by NMSU or an approved International Internship that enhances the students' cultural competency through cultural understanding and experience. Please meet with the head of the Department of Communication Studies for information. Students must pass the course with a C- or higher.

#### Option 5:

Pass (with a C-or higher) any three-credit, upper-division course (numbered 3000 or above) taught in a second language by the department of Languages and Linguistics.

#### Option 6:

Obtain college certification of completion of two years of a second language at the high school level with a grade of C- or higher in the second-year level.

#### Option 7:

By obtaining certification of a working knowledge of a Native American language from the American Indian program director.

#### Option 8:

By obtaining, from the head of the Department of Languages and Linguistics, certification of a working knowledge of a second language if such language is not taught at NMSU.

#### Option 9:

In the case of a foreign student who is required to take the TOEFL exam admission, the dean will automatically waive the second language requirement.
