

ATHLETIC TRAINING - MASTER OF SCIENCE

The Master of Science in Athletic Training (MSAT) program at NMSU comprises 60 credit hours of coursework through traditional and hybrid courses. The MSAT is a 2-year (24-month) professional degree program that starts in June and prepares students to sit for the Board of Certification (BOC) exam leading to the ATC credential. NMSU is currently seeking accreditation for the program through the Commission on Accreditation of Athletic Training Education.
